To provide production details for interactive exhibits within the campus and mobile outreach unit. The exhibits explore the importance of wildlife conservation in Cape Girardeau.

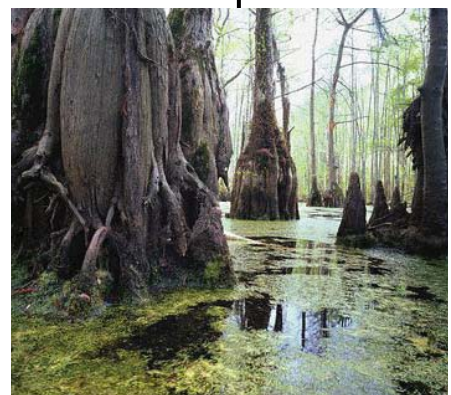
Details:

The indoor exhibit is part of a larger program of discovery trails and wetland restoration. Working under the direction of AldrichPears, we provided detailed development drawings for various exhibits in preparation for the construction tender.

Exhibits demonstrate how to spot and owl, and what it's like inside a beaver dam. Visitors are encouraged to explore their relationship to the animals around the Cape in the replica fur trading cabin. Other exhibits investigate how to wait in a duck blind, or tie a fishing fly.

The mobile outreach unit travels to schools and county fairs. The trailer expands into an indoor exhibit space containing an introduction to the forests of Missouri and the products associated with local natural resources. It is accompanied by a small theater and computer kiosks for flexible programming.

The center opened in May 2005.
